

How can ASEAN expand regional (multilateral) power trading?

To expand regional multilateral electricity trading, strengthen grid resilience and modernisation, and promote clean and renewable energy integration. o The pathway to regional (multilateral) power trading in ASEAN has three different steps, where most progress has been made in bilateral cross border trading.

What is ASEAN Power Grid (APG)?

The ASEAN Power Grid (APG) is a flagship programme mandated in 1997 by the ASEAN Heads of States/Governments under the ASEAN Vision 2020. Note: \*2009 Present value. NO. Why should ASEAN invest in power generation capacity?

ASEAN recognises the critical role of efficient, reliable and resilient electricity infrastructure in stimulating regional economic growth and development. To meet the growing electricity demand, huge investments in power generation capacity will be required.

How many programme areas are there in ASEAN?

Six(6) Programme Areas were introduced namely the: 1) ASEAN Power Grid (APG); 2) Trans-ASEAN Gas Pipeline (TAGP); 3) Energy Efficiency and Conservation (EE&C); 4) New and Renewable Energy (NRE); 5) Coal and Clean Coal Technologies (CCT); and 6) Regional Energy Outlook, Energy Policy and Environmental Analysis.

Why did ASEAN establish electricity interconnecting arrangements?

In recognising the potential advantages to be gained from the establishment of integrated systems, ASEAN established the electricity interconnecting arrangements within the region through the APG under the ASEAN Vision 2020 adopted in the Second ASEAN Informal Summit in Kuala Lumpur on 15 December 1997.

Can ASEAN achieve 23% re share in TPES by 2025?

The steady progress in the deployment of Renewable Energy (RE) projects has enabled ASEAN to increase the share of RE in ASEAN's total primary energy supply (TPES) mix to 13.9% as of 2018. However, more needs to be done under the RE Programme Area to achieve the aspirational target of 23% RE share in the Total Primary Energy Supply (TPES) by 2025.
