Generally this form of supply should only be used for the simplest and smallest power feeds (i.e. no more than a 16A supply), since general purpose power circuits designed to supply sockets in the house, are not intended to provide power for heavy fixed equipment, or to supply substantial currents as a single "point load".

Temporary power equipment should be located on a worksite protected from vehicle traffic, accessible only to authorized persons, and suitable for the environmental conditions that may be present; Calculate the electrical load demand to ensure the temporary power has the capacity to supply all connected loads

Outdoor lighting systems and automatic irrigation may require electricity, along with electric mowers, hedge trimmers, strimmers, shredders and other power equipment used for garden maintenance.
