What is the voltage and frequency of a power plug in Armenia?

In Armenia, the standard voltage is 230 V and the frequency is 50 Hz. Power plug sockets in Armenia are of types C and F. Therefore, the voltage and frequency for a power plug in Armenia are 230 V and 50 Hz.

What voltage does Armenia use?

Armenia runs with the standard voltage of 220-230 V, and 50 Hz frequency. If you come from places such as the UK, Europe, Australia and many countries in Asia and Africa, the standard that you use is 220-240 V. This is just fine and you don't need to get any voltage converters.

Do I need a power plug adapter or voltage converter in Armenia?

In Armenia, the power plug sockets are of types C and F. You will need a power plug adapter if the plugs of your devices do not fit into these sockets. The standard voltage is 230 V and the frequency is 50 Hz.

What is the standard voltage for electric appliances in Armenia?

The standard voltage in Armenia is 230 V. In Armenia, you can use your electric appliances if the standard voltage in your country is between 220 - 240 V. The standard voltage in countries like the UK, Europe, Australia, and most of Asia and Africa is within this range. Manufacturers take these small deviations into account.

Can a traveler use electricity in Armenia?

Travelers from European countries, the UK, and African countries, as well as countries with a standard voltage between 220 V - 240 V, can make use of electricity in Armenia without concern. This is a result of the consideration of deviations in standard voltage supply by manufacturers of appliances from these countries.

Do I need a voltage converter for my laptop in Armenia?

If you come from places such as the UK, Europe, Australia and many countries in Asia and Africa, the standard that you use is 220-240 V. Armenia produced 0.79 mln toe electricity in 2022, of which by nuclear power plant (31.0%), natural gas fired thermal power plants (42.0%), hydro power plants (21%) and wind solar plants (5.7%). Although Armenia's energy mix is dominated by gas, the electricity mix is well diversified in comparison to many of its neighbors.

So If both sides have exactly the same number of turns, the input and output voltage will be exactly the same.
