What is the electricity price in Uzbekistan?

The residential electricity price in Uzbekistan is UZS 295.000 per kWh or USD 0.023. The electricity price for businesses is UZS 900.000 kWh or USD 0.071. These retail prices were collected in March 2024 and include the cost of power, distribution and transmission, and all taxes and fees. Compare Uzbekistan with 150 other countries.

How much energy is consumed in Uzbekistan in 2021?

Total energy consumption increased by 3.7% in 2021 to 47 Mtoe. Previously, it had been decreasing by 3%/year between 2018-2020. Uzbekistan's energy intensity is among the highest in the world but is decreasing very rapidly (-7%/year since 2000).

How much gas does Uzbekistan have?

Uzbekistan has large gas reserves (around 867 bcm of proven reserves) and more modest oil reserves (around 80 Mt) (end of 2021). Around 80% of gas reserves are located in the Amu Darya basin in the Bukhara region. The country also has significant uranium reserves (50 Mt).

Will Uzbekistan become an industrialised middle-income country?

As part of its "Economic Development Vision 2030", the Government plans to transform Uzbekistan into an industrialised middle-income country by achieving a per capita income of US\$6 500 by 2030 and US\$8 500 by 2040. Is Uzbekneftegaz privatised?

Uzbekneftegaz, the national oil and gas company, was partially privatised in 2022. Natural gas accounts for 88% of the power mix. The country aims to double its uranium production by 2030. Diesel prices have increased by 23%/year since 2020. Household electricity prices are quite subsidised and are lower than in other CIS countries.

Is Uzbekneftegaz a public company?

Uzbekneftegaz (76% public) is the national oil and gas company. It was reorganised in 2019 by merging different subsidiaries in the gas and oil upstream and downstream activities. The State sold a 24% stake in the company in 2022 through a public offering (IPO). In total, 620 public companies were meant to be privatised under the same plan.

Business entities such as independent power producers are guaranteed connection to the energy system, including electricity and thermal, and contract with NEGU to supply energy produced from renewable energy sources; the cost of connecting to the energy system, including grid enhancement, is mainly borne by the entities.

Uzbekistan is a net exporting country. Looking at its energy supply, total energy supply was 47.1 Mtoe in 2019. Total energy supply decreased by 22% between 2011 and 2015 due to a slump during the global financial crisis, but has grown by 30% over the last 5 years mainly due to an increase in residential sector consumption.

Uzbekistan's current coal resource base is the Angren lignite deposit and the two smaller Shargun and Boysun coal deposits. According to British Petroleum, proven coal reserves amounted to 1.4 billion toe (Gtoe) (2 Bt) in 2017, which is comparable with data from other organisations (for example, the World Energy Council gives a figure of 1.9 Bt).

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
