

How can Moldova improve the energy sector?

National regulatory framework (both primary and secondary) improved in line with Moldovan energy commitments, ensuring that national authorities are better prepared and can respond to emergency situations in the energy sector and to the needs of the most vulnerable energy users;

Does Moldova rely on Russian energy?

With few natural energy resources, Moldova imports almost all of its energy supplies from Russia and Ukraine. Moldova's dependence on Russian energy is underscored by a more than \$6 billion debt to Russian natural gas supplier Gazprom, largely the result of unreimbursed natural gas consumption in the breakaway region of Transnistria.

Why is Moldova a low energy country?

The Republic of Moldova's low energy self-sufficiency, covering only about 21% of its energy needs domestically, makes it heavily reliant on imports, particularly from the Russian Federation for natural gas and Romania for oil products.

What is the main source of energy in the Republic of Moldova?

In the reference scenario, natural gas, primarily imported from the Russian Federation, remains the main component of the Republic of Moldova's generation mix accounting for over 30% and followed by oil.

Will Moldova reach net-zero by 2050?

However, to attain net-zero by 2050, the renewable energy capacity in the Republic of Moldova will have to increase 4 times from the 2024 levels. Today about 400MW of renewable energy capacity has been installed in the Republic of Moldova - of which about 230MW of solar PV, and 170MW of wind capacity.

Does Moldova import electricity?

The Republic of Moldova's energy sector is heavily reliant on imports, with 80% of its electricity being imported in 2020. Prior to the war in Ukraine, the electricity was mainly imported from Ukraine. Since November 2023, the MGRES gas-fired power plant in Transnistria is making up for the electricity import deficit from Ukraine.

The Ministry of Energy released a calendar for the solicitation targeting wind and solar photovoltaic (PV) projects. According to the schedule, the competition will be launched on April 9 and offers will be accepted over three months. The bulk of the capacity on offer will be set aside for wind projects, for which the planned allocation is 105 MW.

The first tranche includes 60 MW of photovoltaics and 105 MW of wind power. The capacity limit for solar parks is 1 MW and for wind parks 4 MW. The ceiling prices for wind power is 77.88 EUR/MWh and for solar

86.7 EUR/MWh. The guaranteed fixed price will be determined through the auction procedure, but cannot exceed the ceiling price.

It had therefore until December 2017 to make its legislation conform to the EU communautaireacquis,

So, Moldova cannot integrate into the energy system more wind energy than the minimum consumption at night and more solar energy than the maximum consumption during the day. If we produce more green energy than it can consume, it will flow into the Romanian or Ukrainian grid either for free, or Moldova will have to pay to balance the system.

By 2023, Moldova had achieved 348.3 MW of renewable energy capacity (132.7 MW of wind power, of which 115.3 MW net metering, 6.9 MW of solar power, 16.8 MW of hydropower, and 6.6 MW from biogas), and with the addition of 165 MW from the new tenders, the total capacity will reach 513.3 MW, bringing Moldova closer to meeting its daily energy ...
