Renewable energy plays a substantial role in Norway's energy sector. Hydro energy accounts for close to 90 pct. of the total production of electric energy, while on-shore wind power accounts for about 9 pct. The public sector today owns about 90 per cent of the production capacity for electric power in Norway, mainly the state and municipalities.

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
