Where to buy electrical equipment in Porto?

There are several electrical shops in the central area of Porto. For example, there is a shop just at the intersection of "Rua da Alegria" and "Rua Formosa" (not very far from the "Caf#233; Majestic"). The store is called "Proaudio". However, there is not a visible name outside. In the shop window there are some musical equipments.

What type of electrical outlet does Portugal use?

Portugal primarily uses Type C and Type Felectrical outlets. These types are common in many European countries. Also known as the standard "Euro" plug, Type C outlets have two round pins. Also known as "Schuko," Type F outlets have two round pins with two earth clips on the side. The standard voltage in Portugal is 230V, and the frequency is 50Hz.

What voltage does Portugal run on?

Thank you for supporting my coffee and dark chocolate habit! Portugal runs on 230V supply voltage (AC) and 50 Hz frequency. Check any electronics you are bringing. Most newer computers, for example, will have a dual voltage rating of 110 to 240V.

Do I need a power adapter in Portugal?

The standard voltage in Portugal is 230V, and the frequency is 50Hz. Devices from countries with different voltage standards, like the United States (120V), may require a voltage converter in addition to a plug adapter. Do You Need a Power Adapter in Portugal? Whether you'll need a power adapter depends on the type of plug your devices use.

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The electrical outlets in Portugal are the same as those in neighboring Spain: Type C and Type F. They both have two round holes, but Type F also has two grounding clips, while Type C is ungrounded. In Lisbon and throughout Portugal, Type F tends to be the more common outlet type. Type C and Type F plugs are interchangeable, meaning both can take either plug ...

For warranty issues, it also makes sense to buy in Portugal rather than abroad, even for smaller items like a mobile phone. Thanks to EU law, any appliance bought in Portugal (such as a refrigerator or mobile phone) has to have a two-year warranty. This doesn't just apply to those from the UK and US, but a lot of countries outside of the EU.
