Will Uzbekistan fund a 250-megawatt solar photovoltaic plant?

TASHKENT, May 21, 2024 -- The World Bank Group, Abu Dhabi Future Energy Company PJSC (Masdar), and the Government of Uzbekistan have signed a financial package to fund a 250-megawatt (MW) solar photovoltaic plant with a 63-MW battery energy storage system (BESS).

Who will sell electricity to in Uzbekistan?

The project company is committed to selling electricity to the state-owned National Electric Grid of Uzbekistan JSC under a 25-year Power Purchase Agreement for the project, including a 10-year operating term for the BESS component, signed by these two entities.

How will Uzbekistan improve its energy security?

"This project will enhance Uzbekistan's energy security through the use of innovative solutions and technologies," noted Marco Mantovanelli, World Bank Country Manager for Uzbekistan.

Uzbekistan has adopted a number of laws related to energy: the Law on the Rational Use of Energy (April 1997); Law No. 312-II on Production Sharing Agreements (7 December 2001); Law No. 444-II on Subsoil (13 December 2002); Law No. ZRU-225 on Electric Power Engineering (9 September 2009); Law No. ZRU-370 on Joint Stock Companies and Protection ...

The Agency for Development and Regulation of the Energy Market (industry regulator) is created by presidential decree. "Uzenergosotish" JSC will also be created, to which the function of centralized purchase and sale of electricity will be transferred to "National Electric Networks of Uzbekistan" JSC.

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Despite being energy self-sufficient thanks to its gas sector, Uzbekistan's ageing electricity infrastructure struggle to meet the growing domestic energy demand. In May, Nur Bukhara Solar PV LLC FE, a project company owned by Masdar, set out to build a 63 MW battery energy storage system alongside a 250 MW solar plant in the Alat district of the Bukhara region, billed as Uzbekistan's first big BESS project. Most major announcements, however, came from the Saudi Arabian developer itself.

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Uzbekistan's fuel/energy source security is becoming fragile, as the demand for the country's natural gas resources, the main energy source for electricity, is growing fast in other sectors, too. The plans to diversify into solar and wind power generation, possibly also nuclear power, appear well-founded also from the security of supply angle.
